The Big Yellow Bus Project

Area benefits: Gloucestershire

What do they do?

The Big Yellow Bus Project aims to support rough sleepers off our streets as well as the opportunity to get their lives back on track. The Yellow Bus project opened its doors on Christmas Eve 2018 and it has continued to support rough sleepers including through the lockdown from March 2020, working with the council to continue to support the homeless with emergency shelters. Their mission statement includes offering support & guidance, encouraging growth, confidence and stability in life's steps ahead within our community. They provide temporary accommodation for people who are rough sleeping and assist with advice and support for those individuals. They offer one-to-one therapy, support groups and other services, including drop-in sessions three days a week where you can seek support and advice. If we are unable to meet your needs we will work alongside you to find additional support.

Cheltenham Open Door provide a place to meet for those who are suffering hardship. Breakfast and a hot meal are provided on 3 weekdays and on Sundays. Facilities include showers and a free clothes store. Volunteers listen and help with problems, and liaise with other agencies on guests behalf. At Christmas Cheltenham Open Door provide a 4 day shelter for those on their own.

Forest Talk (Forest of Dean Talking Newspaper Association)



Location: Coleford

Area benefits: Forest of Dean

Forest Talk is a free, weekly, recorded 'newspaper' for reading-impaired people who live in, or are interested in, the Forest of Dean, helping them keep in touch with local news and events. It keeps listeners aware of the wider community with familiar and friendly voices in their home each week. Each Saturday, volunteers record a new edition containing 45 minutes of news items from local newspapers, together with 45 minutes of features. The newspaper is recorded on a Memory Stick, which plugs into a player which is provided for each listener on loan.

The talking newspaper memory sticks are posted each Monday in reply-paid pouches. Listeners are asked to put the stick back in the post, in its pouch, after they have finished listening to it.



GRANT MAKING POLICY – General Guidelines

Whilst our constitution and governing documents enable us to make grants to any charitable activity, the Trustees' current policy is to support a number of core charitable activities recommended by our donors.

What we support:

- Older and vulnerable people;
- Vulnerable children and young people;
- Financial hardship for those in poverty or unemployment;
- Health and disability for people experiencing chronic or life-limiting conditions and disabilities;
- Social exclusion and disadvantage for those facing barriers to participating in society.

We do not normally fund:

- Individuals (exceptional circumstances considered);
- Overseas charities;
- Non-registered charities (unless a clear charitable benefit meeting our grant making policy can be demonstrated);
- Running costs;
- General appeals;

Who should apply?

- Due to the modest size and scope of our grants programme we give priority to charities with an annual income not exceeding £300,000;
- Only applications from UK registered charities and local community groups with a written constitution; a bank account with at least two signatories; a
 safeguarding policy that complies with the local authority procedures and operating within the Masonic Province of Gloucestershire are normally
 considered;
- Applications will be sympathetically considered from adjoining counties where it can be demonstrated that services/support are being delivered that
 are directly benefiting Gloucestershire residents;

How much can I apply for?

• We give around £30,000 -£40,000 a year to local charity organisations. £1,000 is the average grant size. Rarely do we give grants that exceed £2,000.

Our standard terms and conditions:

- A GMCA application form and all supporting documents required must be provided before an application will be considered;
- Grants from the Charity are restricted. They may only be used towards the project and costs outlined in the application submitted to the Charity, or as subsequently agreed in writing;
- A charity will acknowledge in writing using its headed paper receipt of the grant and confirm that the grant will only be spent for the approved purpose;
- Any surplus funds not required for the approved purpose are to be refunded to the Charity unless otherwise agreed with our Trustees;
- In accepting a grant from the Charity, a charity agrees to the GMCA using the name of the charity and the project on our website, social media and other materials setting out the activities of the GMCA.

Masonic Housing Scheme

- The Masonic Housing Scheme is designed to promote independent living for those over 60, to match the specific criteria for each home. However, the minimum age for Castlemead Court is 55.
- We have 15 retirement home 1 bed apartments with
 - 9 at Castlemead Court, Westgate Street, Gloucester, with easy access to shops,
 Cathedral and all facilities.
 - 6 at Park View Court with easy access to shops
- Rental values are under usual market rental values for properties of this nature and size.
 - o Castlemead Court £650.00 per calendar month
 - o Park View Court TBC but likely £650.00 to £700.00 per calendar month
 - These are reviewed annually.
- Tenants are only expected to pay their own electric bill, static telephone line should they
 wish to have one & Council Tax



Masonic Housing Scheme

Eligibility

Tenants must meet the minimum area criteria & support independent lifestyle

As a guide the team & trustees when considering applications, us the following criteria:

- The applicants should be elderly Freemasons and/or their dependants, of limited means, and in housing need.
- 2. They, or their spouse, shall have been members of a Lodge, Chapter, Preceptory etc that is a subscribing member of the Gloucestershire Masonic Charities Action.
- 3. They shall be capable of maintaining an independent and active lifestyle taking full advantage of the facilities available.
- 4. The applicants shall be of good character. The Committee reserves the right to request references.
- 5. They should not have made gifts of capital in the previous 3 years, the possession of which would otherwise disqualify them.
- 6. They shall not be in full time paid employment.
- 7. Applications will be dealt with in the order in which they are received. (so it is fair to all parties)
